Abstract

The sector report intends to provide the industrial-wide overview of the Customs Clearance Industry in Myanmar. The survey approached major agents in the customs clearance industry in the market across the hubs in the country including Yangon, Muse and Myawaddy to gain rich sources of information to conduct the study report. The study focuses on the quarterly comparison in the customs clearance rates and changes in market demand to highlight the trends on the primary trading hubs in 2018-19. Moreover, the report underlines the issues experienced by the local customs agents.

Customs Clearance Industry

(2018-2019 Report)

Key Findings

- The customs clearance rates vary by nature of the trading hubs where customs clearance operations are carried out.
- It was observed that **Myanmar Customs Broker Association is now in the progress of planning to propose the implementation of Customs Broker Law.**
- **The customs clearance industry depends on the condition of trade and as the flow of trade was sluggish during the rainy season,** the customs clearance service suffered from such downturn in the trade sector.
- **The customs clearance rates levied in Muse cross-border was higher in May 2018.** The main reasons of the rate escalation are highlighted in the report.
- The study observed the adoption of MACCS in Myawaddy border trade zone and a project for developing customs clearance in Muse cross-border.
- The situation after the suspension of burgeoned trade for re-exports in Muse was observed.
- **Fluctuation in exchange rate was** highlighted as the reason for the variations in customs clearance rates.
- The customs clearance in Yangon became precise after strictly prohibiting the bribery by some customs staffs.
- However, agents faced difficulties due to the **technology failure of MACCS** in both Yangon and Myawaddy border.
- **New establishment of Economic Cooperation Zone along China-Myanmar border** which is a potential for business opportunities for customs agents along with the accelerating border trade.
- **Similarly, the No.2 Friendship Bridge** is expected to bring increased trade between Thailand and Myanmar via the Myawaddy-Maesot border.
